



New Jersey Highlands Coalition **Action Alert**

It's been almost four years since the battle to protect our National Park land and clean energy future from the Susquehanna-Roseland transmission line monstrosity first began and it is more important now than ever that we let President Obama and our Senators know that this project is wrong for New Jersey.

Last month President Obama's administration announced the Susquehanna-Roseland line would be "fast-tracked" as part of a grid modernization program. BUT the Susquehanna-Roseland line is not about renewable energy or grid reliability. The line will import more toxic coal-fired power from Pennsylvania into New Jersey, allowing instate utilities to export cleaner energy produced in New Jersey to New York City where they can charge higher rates. This line will send energy sector jobs to Pennsylvania and our clean energy to New York.

Right now the National Park Service is reviewing the impacts this unneeded, greed-driven power line will have on our public lands and the fast-track program will jeopardize their work. Our National Parks are our treasures that belong to all of us and must be protected from this project.

Join us **November 10 from 3-5:30 pm** at Lurker Park Baseball Field in East Hanover to call on President Obama, Senator Menendez, and Senator Lautenberg to protect our National Park land, the Highlands, and New Jersey's renewable and energy efficiency goals by pulling the Susquehanna-Roseland line from the fast track program.
