New Jersey Climate Change Science Forum – December 7 – New Jersey State House Annex

In response to Governor Christie's November 9th comment that he is skeptical that human activity is contributing to climate change, New Jersey environmental groups are hosting a panel discussion to present the overwhelming scientific findings linking human activity and climate change. The panel will also present a clear picture of the reality of the problem and how it will impact New Jersey.

Several prominent scientists will be speaking at the event, including Alan Robock, Jim Miller, and Paul Falkowski of Rutgers University. Members of the media, the Legislature, environmentalists, the general public and the Governor's staff have been invited.
